Terms and conditions of participation

Selection

- Participation is only open to judges, prosecutors and other judicial staff from EU Member States (except Denmark), Albania and Montenegro.
- 2. The number of places available is limited (35 places). Participation will be subject to a selection procedure. Selection will be dependent on the following criteria:
 - i. the relevance of the seminars to the professional life of the applicant;
 - ii. geographical and language balance among the participants;
 - iii. ability to disseminate the information obtained;
 - iv. in the case of an excess of applications, only one participant per institution may be accepted;
 - v. in case of applicants with the same qualifications, the first applicant to register will be selected.
- 3. Applications should be submitted by **9 September 2020**.
- A response will be sent to every applicant shortly after this deadline. We advise you
 not to book any travel or hotel before you receive our confirmation.

Travel expenses

6. Travel expenses will be reimbursed to a maximum of 400 euros only for participants coming from abroad. Participants coming from Bulgaria will reimbursed to a maximum of 150 euros.
