5. STUDY VISIT AT THE HAGUE CONFERENCE ON PRIVATE INTERNATIONAL LAW (HCCH)

Presentation

This visit aims at giving an insight to family judges of the EU MS about the main instruments of the Hague Conference on Private International Law (Conventions, Protocols and Principles) in the area of international family law. The visit will cover the Conventions on the civil aspects of international child abduction, the protection of children and cooperation in respect of intercountry adoption, the jurisdictions applicable law, recognition, enforcement, cooperation in respect or parental responsibility and measures for the protection of children, the international recovery of child support and other forms of family maintenance as well as the protocol on the law applicable to maintenance obligations. The visit will also provide for EU law perspective and relations between The Hague Conventional system and the EU law system.
