

# GENERAL EXCHANGES

### ABOUT

In a General exchange, a participant has the unique opportunity to actively explore another judicial culture by being hosted for one or two weeks in the court or prosecution office of another EU Member State.

After an introduction to the judicial system of the host country, the participant is immersed into the daily work of a national court or prosecution office. The exchange format offers room for discussions, debates, and networking with fellow foreign judges, prosecutors and court staff. Through visits in high-level institutions of the host country and meetings with other professionals such as law enforcement or civil society, participants get a comprehensive overview of the work of a judge, prosecutor or court staff in another country.

General exchanges are designed to foster mutual trust and understanding as well as building a feeling of belonging to a common judicial area among the EU judiciary.
